#### **Parent Questionnaire**

We would like to say thank you to those parents who completed the parent questionnaire. The responses were very positive with a very high percentage of parents strongly agreeing with the statement, 'I would recommend this school to another parent', which was very pleasing. #### **Scarlet Fever**

The Public Health Agency (PHA) is advising parents to be aware of the symptoms of scarlet fever following an increase in the number of cases in schools across the UK. Scarlet fever is a bacterial illness that mainly affects children under 10 but people of any age can catch it. It is not usually a serious illness, but can result in complications, therefore treatment with antibiotics is recommended. The symptoms of scarlet fever may include: **sore throat; headache; high temperature; nausea and vomiting.** 

To limit the spread of scarlet fever it is important to wash hands with warm water and soap, not share drinking glasses or utensils, and cover the nose and mouth when coughing or sneezing. If your child has scarlet fever it is important that you contact school. Your child will not be able to return to school until 24 hours after taking the first dose of antibiotics.

## A Big Thank you

The money has been used to buy Geography books that will support learning in the classroom.
