SMSC Whole School Overview

Spiritual Development

We develop pupil's spiritual development by increasing their ability to be reflective about their own beliefs, religious or otherwise, to inform their perspective on life and their interest in and respect for different people's faiths, feelings and values. Pupils will develop a sense of enjoyment and fascination in learning about themselves, others and the world around them. Pupils are given opportunities to develop their use of imagination and creativity in their learning and through this their willingness to reflect on their own experiences.

Moral Development

We develop pupil's moral development by increasing their ability to recognise the differences between right and wrong and how they can apply this understanding to their own lives. Pupils will be taught how to recognise legal boundaries and in doing so, respect the civil and criminal law of England. Pupils will also develop their moral development by understanding and accepting the consequences of their actions and behaviour. We will provide opportunities for pupils to engage and show an interest in investigating and offering reasoned views about moral and ethical issues and support them in being understanding and appreciative of the views of others.

Social Development

We develop pupil's social development and their social skills by providing opportunities for them to work and socialise with other pupils from different religious, ethnic and socio-economic backgrounds. Pupils will be willing to participate in a variety of communities and social settings through volunteering, helping and cooperating well with others in order to develop their ability to resolve conflicts effectively. Our social development learning promotes an acceptance of and engagement with the fundamental British values of democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of others with different faiths and beliefs. Pupils will be able to demonstrate the skills and attitudes needed to enable them to participate fully and contribute positively to life in modern Britain.

Cultural Development

We develop pupil's cultural development by helping them to understand and appreciate the cultural influences that have shaped their heritage and that of others. In doing so, pupils are taught to understand and appreciate the range of different cultures in and out of school to help prepare them for life in modern Britain and further afield. Pupils will be encouraged to recognise and value commonalities across cultural, religious, ethnic and socio-economic communities. Pupils will be taught an awareness of Britain's democratic parliamentary system and its central role in shaping our history, our values and its role in continuing to develop Britain. Pupils will be given opportunities to participate in and respond positively to artistic, musical, sporting and other cultural opportunities. Pupils will be encouraged to improve their cultural development by showing an interest in exploring and improving their understanding of and showing respect for different faiths and cultural diversity. This will be demonstrated through their attitudes towards different religions, ethnic and socio-economic groups in local, national and global communities.
